

- •Procurement Laws usually require the procuring authority to issue public bids if the value of the procurement exceeds a certain threshold.
- Financial Reporting and/or Business Transactions
- Business transactions for federal funds could be more restrictive -Office of Management and Budget's Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles and Audit Requirements Part 200.






BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 15 Section 1. Sections 16-13B-1, 16-13B-4, and 16-13B-5 of 16 17 the Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows: 18 "§16-13B-1 19 (a) (1) This chapter shall apply to county boards of education and city boards of education, or any combination of city and county boards of education as herein provided for the 22 competitive bidding of certain contracts. With the exception of contracts for public works whose competitive bidding 24 requirements are governed exclusively by Title 39, all expenditure of funds of whatever nature for labor, services, work, or for the purchase of materials, equipment, supplies,

or other personal property involving-fifteen thousand dollars

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

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290-1-4-.01 Program Plans

290-1-4-.01 Program Plans. Local boards of education shall submit a comprehensive education plan to the State Superintendent pursuant to state and federal laws and regulations, and other requirements specified by the State Superintendent. The comprehensive education plan shall include the following:

- (1) Capital Improvement.
- (2) Transportation.
- (3) Professional Development.
- (4) Technology.
- (5) Special Education.
- (6) At-Risk.
- (7) Career/Technical Education.

- (9) Other requirements to promote improved education opportunity and provide better schools.

(1) New construction or renovation of school facilities, including maintenance or repair of HVAC or roofing,

facilities, including maintenance or repair of HVAC or roofing, with an estimated cost of \$750,000 or more shall have the approval of the State Superintendent of Education.

(2) New construction shall take school only at place centers approved by the State Superintendent of Education.

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
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


ADMINISTRATIVE CODE
